

# **Supply List**

**Class Name: Introduction to Fabric Painting**

The following supplies are needed for this class; however, <u>please DO NOT purchase any</u> supplies until you receive an email from Metro, confirming that the class is running.

(Periodically classes are cancelled due to low enrollment).

An email confirmation will be sent a minimum of 2 business days prior to the class start date or you will be notified that the class has been cancelled.

Please note: If you do not receive an email as stated above, please be sure to check your spam inbox.

### YOU WILL NEED TO BRING:

- Plastic to cover your table & underneath your table
- Water container and spray/mist bottle
- Paper Towels
- Masking Tape
- Salt (small shaker of table salt)
- Gloves for your hands if you prefer and an apron or old shirt to wear!
- Plastic tray/paint tray to mix paints on. Little bowls work great as you will be using water as well in the mix.
- A small piece of sea sponge
- Paint brushes INEXPENSIVE wider brushes and/or foam brushes.
- Fabric paints SETA color or Jacquard fabric paints. Colors suggested to start are:
  Red, yellow, blue, white and black. Extras are always welcome if you want. These are
  readily available at The Paint Spot. You may purchase either Transparent or Opaque
  paints, but hold off on metallic and pearl for now. Do NOT purchase Jacquart Dy-naFlow, as they are very watery and won't work for our advanced techniques.
- Scissors
- Fabric to paint on approximately 2 metres of 100% cotton white fabric. We will then cut this into smaller pieces to play on.
- Extra plastic bags to carry wet painted fabrics home in.
- Optional: Blow dryer to speed up drying times

#### Class 2:

• Everything as above, but fresh fabric is not required. Please bring the pieces you painted in the first class back to the second class to further work on.



- Mark making tools items around the house that can turn into great unique stamps, such as an old potato masher, make-up sponge, shaped erasers, old credit cards/room key cards to cut up.
- Scissors
- Geli Plate printing plate (available at The Paint Spot) and/or a piece of plexi-glass. We are going to do some Monoprinting.
- Copy paper and paper scissors to cut templates out of for some Negative Painting techniques.

## Teacher will provide:

- Stencils to share
- Stamps "
- A piece of printed fabric for each student to do techniques on
- Other mark-making tools

#### For both classes:

• Your sense of fun and adventure! Please do not feel intimidated by any of the above, as fabric painting is relaxing, fun and a return to your inner creativity.

Please feel free to bring any additional supplies you have.
