Required	Pictures/images for inspiration: -landscapes, easy street scenes, etc. (use your own photography or magazine images)		
Required	Ruler, pencil sharpener, pencil (HB works fine), eraser (soft art or fabric eraser)		Fabric erasers are available at local quilt stores
Required	A few sheets of 8 ½" X 11" drawing paper to do drafts on first		Computer paper works fine
Required	100% cotton fabric, white (0.5 meters will do)	Usually @ \$12 per meter	Local quilt stores carry
Required	Wax crayons – Crayola brand work best – treat yourself to a large box.	24 pack is approximately \$10.00	

Required	Derwent InkTense Crayons – try to get a selection of basic colours (red, yellow, blue, green, orange, black, etc.)	Approximately \$2.99/ crayon	Available at Delta Art and at the Paint Spot (you can buy individuals or sets)
Required	A small tube of white acrylic paint for highlights	Approximately \$10.00	Available at Delta Art, the Paint Spot, Wal-Mart, etc.
Required	Micron or fine Sharpie felt pen for outlining	Under \$5	Available at Delta Art and at the Paint Spot, Wal-Mart, etc.
Required	Small vessel for holding water PLUS a few paintbrushes (watercolour brushes 0.5 to 1” are great)		Basic brushes can be found at art stores and sometimes the dollar store (these do not have to be high-end brushes!)

Notes/Other:

When creating your fabric landscape, you are opening the door to a new medium that crosses between traditional paintings and fibre art wall hangings that you can embellish and stitch further. Your instructor will bring along several “add on” items for you to try during the class, especially in the second class where we will talk about further embellishments on our artworks. Use of items such as glitter pens, DMC floss, collage ideas and stencilling will be demonstrated.

In the second class, we will also discuss mounting and displaying options for your new art.
