

# Supply List

## Class Name: Oil Painting Step-by-Step

The following supplies are needed for this class, however, **please DO NOT purchase any** supplies until you receive an email from Metro, confirming that the class is running

(periodically classes are cancelled due to low enrollment). An email confirmation will be sent a minimum of 2 business days prior to the class start date or you will be notified that the class has been cancelled. **Please note:** If you do not receive an email as stated above, be sure to check your spam inbox.

#### Please bring the following supplies to class:

**Tip:** When buying supplies, remember to take your Metro class receipt. Many art stores offer a discount to students.

#### Paints:

- Cadmium red light or Permanent red
- Cadmium yellow medium or Winsor yellow
- Ultramarine blue
- Quinacridone magenta or Alizarin Crimson
- Cerulean blue
- Titanium white

Note: Please buy student grade paints or the best paints you can afford. Quality student grade oil paints are Van Gogh or Winton. Or buy artist's quality paints on sale!

Brushes: long handled, hog bristle only

• Flats -sizes: 2, 4, 6 and round size: 4

#### Painting surfaces:

- 4 canvases or hard board or canvas boards:
- 1 sized 8"x10"; 2 sized 10"x12" and 1 sized 12"x16"

#### Paint mixing supplies:

- 2 palette knives (the small, triangle shaped ones are best for mixing oils)
- 1 pkg palette paper or a flat plastic palette



### Cleaning supplies:

- jar with a lid (preferably plastic) for cleaning brushes
- 1 roll of paper towels or lots of cotton rags for cleaning brushes & hands
- linseed oil (250 ml)
- latex gloves to protect hands, optional

## Other supplies:

- 10" x 12" or similar size sketch book or paper
- 3B pencil
- eraser

## Note from the Instructor:

Due to sensitivities and allergies, we will not use solvents in this class. We will use linseed oil as a medium and Linseed oil and citrus thinner to clean brushes. Bring all the oil paint supplies you have. I will talk about safe practices for painting with oils and painting without solvents.
